

The Museum fulfills this mission by using its large permanent collection of the artist's sculpture, paintings, mosaics, ceramics, furniture, works on paper, personal papers and artifacts documenting his life. Specifically, the collection is used to demonstrate creative artistic expression, enable people of all ages to discover and develop their own talents, as well as achieve a deeper understanding of themselves and the connection of humankind with the environment and other living beings.

The Steffen Thomas Museum and Archives, Inc. dba Steffen Thomas Museum of Art (STMA) is a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organization, and is open and staffed on a regular schedule.



It takes the support of our members to do the work we do. At STMA, we are producing exciting and engaging exhibitions, meaningful school programs, and accessible public programs. We continue to serve our local communities through keeping admission low and offering many free events throughout the year. We've seen an increase in visitation, both from walk-in guests and scheduled tour groups. The number of participating students is holding steady, with many schools (including a new group: Putnam County Pre-K!) already scheduled for FY2025. We're moving forward in our journey towards sustainability while increasing our relevance and commitment to our expanding museum community. Locally, across Georgia and the Southeast, and, looking to the future, around the world.

Sara Thomas's vision, hard work, and diligent archiving brought this museum into existence. She was ahead of her time when she initiated the impressive digital catalog of Steffen's work, containing over 8000 records, including STMA's permanent collection, the Thomas family collections, collections held both privately and in other museums, and the public work (like *Trilon*). The work continues as unrecorded art becomes known to us, as research on public works and collections brings new information to light, and as we tackle the digitizing and recording of all the non-art material in the archives. Soon, STMA's permanent collection will be available to search online, through our website.

This museum, dedicated to preserving and exhibiting the immense and varied collections of Steffen Thomas art, is also responsible for sharing Steffen's life story and, perhaps most importantly, his credo: This world is too small for less than brotherhood, too dangerous for less than truth. Help us share this message, so consistently represented in Steffen's work, with the world. Your support is vital.



# **Something To Declare**

The Steffan Thomas Museum of Art has "Something to Declare." And so do we.

Director of the STMA, Alyson Vuley, said it best when she stated, "With this exhibit we want to stress the importance of two things: diversity and representation." Our beliefs in our class are very similar. We believe that in order to create a harmonious society there needs to be diversity and representation for the Latin American community.

In the STMA's new exhibit, titled "Something to Declare," we found art that stands for these big virtues in our tiny town.

After giving us a brief history on Steffen Thomas, Ms. Vuley informed us about the art exhibit taking place in the museum. The STMA has created a space for artists originally from various countries in Latin America who now live in Georgia. Some artists are even as close as Athens. The event showcases 12 artists who use mediums ranging from pencil and masking tape to oils and acrylics. We learned that a lot of the artists in the exhibit have regular "day jobs."

For example, Jorge Arcos who is originally from Mexico City, also paints houses, but having the opportunity to showcase his works in exhibits like "Something to Declare" allow him, and others like him, an opportunity to shine. Another artist we found particularly interesting was Marisa Cerban who is originally from Uruguay. She creates art by adding rice and beads into her works. She

has brought to life the vibrant colors and customs of Latin America using everyday material.

One may ask what the inspiration for these artists might be. After viewing their works, we feel they have the mutual goal of eliciting emotions. They are the voices of our Latin American community. They want people to see us and our cultures. They want people in our community and beyond to see where creativity can take us; how beautiful customs and art coming from Latin America can be.

The Steffen Thomas Museum of Art is an amazing place for us to have here in Morgan County. These artists on display reflect who we are. We are able to see ourselves in their work. You definitely want to go and make sure you're able to see it too.

Remember, no matter who you are, you always have "something to declare."

The STMA is open every Tuesday through Saturday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. The "Something to Declare" exhibit is open to the public now through Jan. 6, 2024. Admission is free to all schools on field trips.





# From Don

With a national election looming in less than two months, there is a sense of excitement in the air. Nowhere is that more evident than at the Steffen Thomas Museum of Art as we mark the end of another successful, prideful fiscal year. How could we not be proud of the many accomplishments of this year:

- The exhibition of the Marjorie and Richard Lowrance Collection of Steffen Thomas art, featuring 100 of the best works produced by Steffen over his 60+ year career, bequeathed to STMA in 2021, and curated by Andy and Hathia Hayes.
- Something to Declare, the exquisite exhibition of Contrapunto, the collective of Latin American artists based in Georgia, and other invited artists, highlighting the talents and rich diversity of Latin America culture.
- The incredible recognition ((three nominations and one award from the Southeast Regional EMMY® Awards) bestowed upon Steffen Thomas: Rock and Chisel, the documentary film by filmmaker Jesse Stephen Freeman on the life, art and legacy of Steffen Thomas.
- The additional screenings of the film across the state in Athens, in Lagrange, in Macon, and in Rome at Berry College with a special selection of Steffen Thomas artworks. And, thanks to the support of The Halle Foundation, more screenings to come.
- The breathtaking chamber music concert in the Main Gallery featuring the soundtrack of the film, original
  music by David Kirkland Garner, and a selection of eight lieder by composer Robert Schumann. The energy
  in the room that night the excitement, the pride as we were joined by the Madison Morgan Cultural
  Center community, was palpable.
- The Three C's: Curating, Collecting and Conserving event, featuring curator Dr. Andi McKenzie from the Michael C. Carlos Museum; collectors Andy Hayes, Natasha Chambliss and myself; and Larry Shutts of Savant & Shutts Art Conservation. Attendees heard insightful presentations, including three distinct approaches to collecting art, all grounded in a sincere appreciation for the artists who produce such great expressions of humanity.

Yet, there is some sadness as I rotate off the board, having served the maximum number of consecutive years permitted under the museum's by-laws. Serving as the Board President of this wonderful institution has been one of the greatest honors of my life. In my opinion, community service is one of the greatest expressions of brotherly (agape) love. I am eternally grateful that I got to share my love with the board, staff and members of STMA and the people that we serve.

As many know, one of the main features which attracted me to STMA was Steffen Thomas' strong embrace of the Brotherhood of Mankind — that we are a family of universal commonalities and that arts education is integral to a vibrant and connected community. I was also impressed how, over 27 years, the museum has used Steffen's beliefs to support disadvantaged and underserved artists and communities.

Over my 6 years of service, I have pushed the board to hold true to Steffen's ideals and to understand what it means to practice brotherhood in our time. Perhaps it is fitting therefore that my term of office is ending with one of our most powerful efforts to date to embrace community. Queer Perspectives, on display until January 4, is our attempt to provide a platform for the visual artists representing the many facets of metropolitan Atlanta's and Georgia's LGBTQ+ community. It is a strong show. I urge you to gather your family, your friends, your neighbors, and your co-workers, church members, schoolmates and teammates and come see this incredible body of work. As you view the work of these artists, including a special exhibition by the indefatigable and incredibly talented Freddie Styles, you will see Steffen's philosophy on full display.

As I leave the board, I want to publicly thank the board, past and present, the staff and my comrades in arms -Lisa, Alyson and Pamala - for their undying support. It has been great traveling this road with you. Together, we have broadened the museum's profile in Madison, Morgan County, Middle Georgia, Atlanta and beyond. Together, we have increased the number of visitors, boosted grants and donations, and bolstered programming in vital areas. Truly, we have found and spread Joy in Art.

I especially want to thank Lisa and the Thomas Family for their longstanding support of the museum. Many reading this letter will see Lisa's tireless efforts as a loving daughter's commitment to both her father's legacy and her mother's vision. However, to understand Lisa's special brand of commitment, you have to add in her own love of art, her own commitment to arts education and to the youth of Morgan County and Middle Georgia. Throw in her spunk and resiliency and you will understand how, despite the legendary challenges of small art institutions, she has willed our fledging "little" museum to a place of prominence among Atlanta's proudest cultural institutions. Congratulations, Lisa, on a job well done.

So, I end with words of encouragement and good cheer, a challenge and a question to you, our loyal members. First, the challenge. As Alyson and staff continue to roll out rich programming, please turn out regularly. Renew your memberships promptly each year. And spread the word. Invite others to join the museum. In other words, lean in to the future. Add your shoulder to the wheel, as we all embrace the opportunity to establish STMA, this hidden jewel, as a permanent community asset — a place of prominence in the landscape of Middle Georgia.

Thus, the question. When it is said and done, what will the 22nd Century say about OUR dreams, OUR vision, OUR commitment, OUR legacy? Steffen and Sara created a wonderful legacy. Let's build on theirs to create our own legacy — like Steffen, to live our values and beliefs through our commitment to our fellow citizens of the world; like Sara, to be bold in our vision for the museum and faithful to its execution; and like Lisa, to be unwavering in our mission, to be willing to adapt, to lead or to follow, over years or decades, to do our part to carry the museum to ever higher heights.

# FY2024 School Programs

Inspired by educators like Martha Berry and Dr. George Washington Carver, both of whom Steffen created portrait busts, Steffen became an Art Supervisor for the National Youth Administration of the WPA in the late 1930's. Likewise, we continue to be inspired by these educators and by Steffen's commitment to arts education, through STMA's school and community arts outreach programs.

Thanks to the support of Georgia Power Foundation, Walmart Foundation, and STMA members, we are able to offer free tours to K-12 schools from all of our surrounding counties. This past year, we served over 400 students from Morgan, Greene, Putnam, and Newton Counties.

During the exhibition of Something to Declare/Algo para Declarar, Jenny Cofield's Communications class from Morgan County High School toured the exhibition and interviewed Alyson. See page 5 for the English version of the article they published in our local newspaper! Debbie Vogel brought AP Art students from Lake Oconee Academy to tour the exhibition and do studies of their choice of artist. Several students created work inspired by the exhibition for their final projects. Very impressive!

In March, 350 students participated in a program offered in conjunction with *Peace in Our Time: Steffen Thomas Meisterwerke from the Lowrance Collection* and sponsored by Central Georgia EMC Foundation's Operation Round Up grant. Each student received a sketchbook and pencil to keep. They toured the exhibition and did closer-looking activities including drawing in the galleries, reading labels, and writing critiques. They took their sketches and notes back to their art rooms and created artworks inspired by Steffen's art from *Peace in Our Time*, using grant-funded art materials (oil pastels and paper), and wrote artists' statements. Teachers then selected works for the students exhibition and competition. Juried by Mandy Adams, Trish Thurman, and Lisa Conner, 16 cash prizes were awarded for first and second place, best artist's statement, and director's choice for elementary, middle, and high school levels. The students' art and writing were on view all summer in the Education Gallery.

# Strategic Plan 2020-2025 Summary

Steffen Thomas's philosophy of The Brotherhood of Mankind - that we are a family of universal commonalities and that arts education is integral to a vibrant and connected community - informs all we do. In Steffen's own words, "This world is too small for less than brotherhood - too dangerous for less than truth."

STMA undertook a strategic planning process in 2020, complete with a SWOT analysis (strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, threats), and the Board of Directors approved the revised strategic plan at their October 2021 meeting. This analysis contributed to the differentiation of several broad objectives, each with associated goals and strategies. They include:

- Ensure the museum's financial stability through a combination of grant-seeking, the development of Planned Giving and Major gifts programs, and the expansion of inventory available in the gift shop and online to generate additional revenues.
- Improve operational stability through leadership and communication, staff development and training, volunteer and internship recruitment and training, and the design and implementation of multi-year plan for the Steffen Thomas Legacy Archive Project.
- Expand programs and exhibitions as a way to broaden our exposure, define new audiences and raise the museum's profile locally, regionally, and nationally.
- Increase public access to the collection through continued development of the archival database, making the database available online, and encouraging use for academic and scholarly research.

Our guiding focus is to continue to use the strengths of the museum to create new opportunities and relationships while also forging ways to lessen the weaknesses and to build underlying financial and Board administration duties to guarantee that Steffen's legacy will continue. We are committed to discovering new audiences, new sources of financial support, and novel approaches to the stewardship of all the resources entrusted to our care.

We will accomplish our 2020–2025 Strategic Goals through a combination of discovery, creativity, and focused work, informed by our stewardship of the many resources that we hold in trust. We have the duty to: care for our permanent collection through conservation, documentation, research, and access; present thoughtful and engaging exhibitions; responsibly use the financial resources provided to us; and communicate the fulfillment of our mission to key stakeholders.


